Frequently asked questions

How do I write an interesting hook?

Successful hooks tend to have several traits. Most importantly, they share a surprising or intriguing fact. They give readers enough context to understand the hook, but leave enough out to make them want to learn more. They are written for a general audience who has no prior knowledge of or interest in the topic area. Lastly, they are concise, and do not attempt to cover multiple facts or present information about the subject beyond what's needed to understand the hook.

When will my nomination be reviewed?

This page is often backlogged. As long as your submission is still on the page, it will stay there until an editor reviews it. Since editors are encouraged to review the oldest submissions first, it may take several weeks until your submission is reviewed. In the meantime, please consider reviewing another submission (not your own) to help reduce the backlog (see instructions below). Because of WP:DYKTIMEOUT, a nomination should be reviewed within two months since the reviewer/promoter may agree to reject and close an unpromoted hook after that time has passed.

Where is my hook?

If you can't find the nomination you submitted to this nominations page, it may have been approved and is on the approved nominations page waiting to be promoted. It could also have been added to one of the prep areas, promoted from prep to a queue, or is on the main page.

If the nominated hook is in none of those places, then the nomination has probably been rejected. Such a rejection usually only occurs if it was at least a couple of weeks old and had unresolved issues for which any discussion had gone stale. If you think your nomination was unfairly rejected, you can query this on the DYK discussion page or with the closer, but as a general rule such nominations will only be restored in exceptional circumstances. If your nomination was promoted, but it hasn't reached the main page after two weeks, you can also query this on the DYK discussion page.

Instructions for reviewers

Main page: Wikipedia:Did you know/Reviewer instructions

Any editor who was not involved in writing/expanding or nominating an article may review it by checking to see that the article meets all the DYK criteria (long enough, new enough, no serious editorial or content issues) and the hook is cited. Editors may also alter the suggested hook to improve it, suggest new hooks, or even lend a hand and make edits to the article to which the hook applies so that the hook is supported and accurate. For more information on the DYK rules and review processes, see the DYK guidelines and the reviewer instructions.

To post a comment or review on a DYK nomination, follow the steps outlined below:

- Look through this page, Template talk:Did you know, to find a nomination you would like to comment on.
- Click the "Review or comment" link at the top of the nomination. You will be taken to the nomination subpage.
- The top of the page includes a list of the DYK criteria. Check the article to ensure it meets all the relevant criteria.
- To indicate the result of the review (i.e., whether the nomination passes, fails, or needs some minor changes), leave a signed comment on the page. Please begin with one of the 5 review symbols that appear at the top of the edit screen, and then indicate all aspects of the article that you have reviewed; your comment should look something like the following:

Article length and age are fine, no copyvio or plagiarism concerns, reliable sources are used. But the hook needs to be shortened.

If you are the first person to comment on the nomination, there will be a line `:* <!-- REPLACE THIS LINE TO WRITE FIRST COMMENT, KEEPING :* -->` showing you where you should put the comment.

- Save the page.
- After the nomination is approved, a bot will automatically list the nomination page on [Template talk:Did you know/Approved](#).

If there is any problem or concern about a nomination, please consider notifying the nominator by placing `{{subst:DYKproblem|Article|header=yes|sig=yes}}` on the nominator's talk page.

How to remove a rejected nomination

- Open the DYK nomination subpage of the nomination you would like to remove.
- In the window where the DYK nomination subpage is open, replace the line `{{DYKsubpage}}` with `{{subst:DYKsubpage}}`, and replace `|passed=` with `|passed=no`. Then save the page. This has the effect of wrapping up the discussion on the DYK nomination subpage in a blue archive box and stating that the nomination was unsuccessful, as well as adding the nomination to a category for archival purposes.
- Alternatively, you can use [PSHAW](#), which automates the process.

How to remove a hook from the prep areas or queue

- Edit the prep area or queue where the hook is and remove the hook and the credits associated with it.
- Go to the hook's nomination subpage (there should have been a link to it in the credits section).
 - View the edit history for that page
 - Go back to the last version *before* the edit where the hook was promoted, and revert to that version to make the nomination active again.
 - Add a new icon on the nomination subpage to cancel the previous tick and leave a comment after it explaining that the hook was removed from the prep area or queue, and why, so that later reviewers are aware of this issue.
- Add a transclusion of the template back to this page so that reviewers can see it. It goes under the date that it was first created/expanded/listed as a GA. You may need to add back the day header for that date if it had been removed from this page.
- If you removed the hook from a queue, it is best to either replace it with another hook from one of the prep areas, or to leave a message at [WT:DYK](#) asking someone else to do so.

How to move a nomination subpage to a new name

- Don't; it should not ever be necessary, and will break some links which will later need to be repaired. Even if you change the title of the article, you don't need to move the nomination page.

The issue with that hook is that it violates WP:DYKFICTION. That is, it is about an in-universe fact (in this case, about the main character's jobs) that does not have a connection to the real world. - ALT2 I agree is not suitable; however, I'd phrase why it isn't from a different perspective. I've been advised by other reviewers that hooks on artistic/literally works which contain long quotes from critical reviews generally do not do well as far as views go which we could say speaks to [WP:DYKINT](#).
- ALT3, I agree that the nominator should find different wording/phrasing than using the term "Sound-world", as I had to look that up to find out what it means. Again a [WP:DYKINT](#) issue.
- You didn't state anything about ALT0, where I do see an issue. The wording from the source which supports the hook is "[Madara no Hana \(Flower of Madara\) and Kurai Tobira \(The Dark Gate\)—blend Western orchestral form with Japanese imagery, marking the birth of his East-West musical synthesis](#)". This hook is close paraphrasing to the source. When we review we need to make sure that not only are there no copyvio issues with the article itself, but that the proposed hooks are not close in their paraphrasing. I would suggest ALT0 needs work.

- Article is new enough and long enough. QPQ not required. There do not appear to be any copyvios and the Earwig tool came back unlikely. The hook is interesting and less than 200 characters. However, there are a number of issues:
 - The "Biography" section is completely unsourced. Reliable sources need to be added for those facts.
 - The source for the sentence about the replica of the rail car at the Semakh Historic Railway Station museum failed verification, as the source does not mention the rail car at all. On the other hand I found and added a source for a separate fact in the article that could be used as a source to say a replica of the rail car is at a memorial site in Semakh (perhaps the railway station museum is that memorial site but then that would need a reliable source).
 - The last paragraph about the YMCA has one source that also does not verify any of the facts in that paragraph. I found a blog site that mentions some of those facts but that does not appear to be a reliable source. So either reliable sources for those facts need to be added, or the paragraph needs to be removed.
 - The source supporting the hook blocks me when I try to link to it from Wikipedia. I was able to link to it separately, but it is not clear that the source is reliable. I did find and add reliable source that mostly supports the hook. However, if that source is used, the hook needs to be revised slightly to something like:

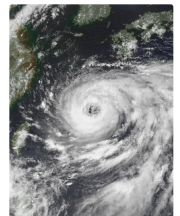

That section is extraneous and if anything could belong in a completely different Wikipedia article (maybe). It also pushes down the main content of the article and in this day and age of scrolling rather than reading, no one has patience to wade through a bunch of extra information they weren't expecting like "what is the World Cup". In any case, point 3 in the checklist requires more work. QPQ is done. Hooks have a bunch of problems: All hooks suffer from MOS:SEAOFLUE, an excessive number of blue links to common words and phrases that confuse the reader as to where they should click (the objective is to get them to read the article about Freddy, remember?). ALT0 definitely does not qualify as a picture hook, as Langley is not the main subject of the article. Also it seems funny only to a limited audience (Americans who know what Langley is referring to the CIA headquarters). The whole thing seems like an oversimplification as well. Perhaps the hook can still be saved but it needs a bit more thought put into it. ALT1 fails the interesting test (what is a GTA lobby? even if I work out that it's a Grand Theft Auto reference, why is it interesting to a broad audience?). Also the sourcing for that hook fails point 5 in the checklist (though perhaps an alternate source could be found). 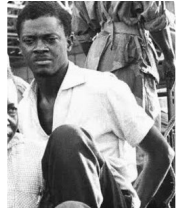

The description on Commons claims that AP did not renew the copyright for the image, but the AP's website shows the image & claims that it is copyrighted (<https://newsroom.ap.org/editorial-photos-videos/detail?itemid=dd762c2aade0da11af9f0014c2589dfb&mediatype=photo>). Therefore, I think the Commons version of the image needs to be deleted, because it is not actually in the public domain.
2. The caption for the larger version of the image says it is Lumumba and two unknown aids, but the man to his left may actually be his vice president, Joseph Okito, per Getty Images in an alternative/sequential photo [18] (<https://www.gettyimages.com/detail/news-photo/picture-taken-in-december-1960-shows-soldiers-guarding-news-photo/158270804>)
3. The language of the hook is almost restrained to the point of misleading readers. What I mean is: he was prime minister and was assassinated, but the language of the hook almost changes readers' understanding of who he was & what happened to him. Does that make sense? Also, I wonder if you've considered any alternative hooks?
4. There are a couple "citation needed" tags that I added to the article. Some footnotes and also sentences at the end of paragraphs (after a citation in the previous sentence) do not have a citation. Also, there's an instance where a paragraph preceding a blockquote is missing a citation, whereas the blockquote has a citation... typically per [WP:BLOCKQUOTE](#), you want the citation at the end of the sentence or paragraph that precedes/introduces the blockquote.
5. Just a note for you: there are many references in Sources section that are not actually cited. I can see them with [User:Trappist the monk/HarvErrors.js](#) -- I don't think you need to fix those for DYK, but I think it's worth cleaning those up when you have a chance (maybe move unused references to "further reading"?)

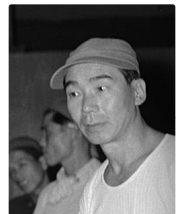

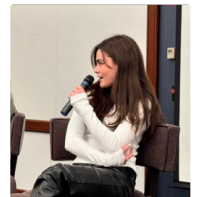

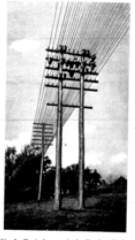


Fig. 9 - Typical open wire line serving 21 circuits

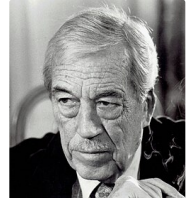

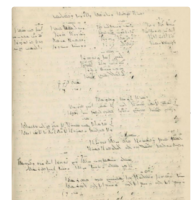

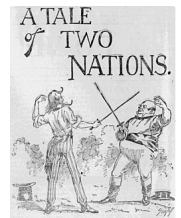
