

Cross-origin embedder policy



The `cross_origin_embedder_policy` manifest key lets the extension specify a value for the Cross-Origin-Embedder-Policy

(<https://developer.mozilla.org/docs/Web/HTTP/Headers/Cross-Origin-Embedder-Policy>) (COEP) response header for requests to the extension's origin. This includes the extension's service worker, popup, options page, tabs that are open to an extension resource, etc.

Together with cross_origin_opener_policy

(/docs/extensions/mv3/manifest/cross_origin_opener_policy), this key allows the extension to opt into cross-origin isolation (</docs/extensions/mv3/cross-origin-isolation>).

Manifest declaration

Note: This key was introduced in Chrome 93.

The `cross_origin_embedder_policy` manifest key contains an object with one property named `value` that takes a string. Chrome uses this string as the value of the `Cross-Origin-Embedder-Policy` header when serving resources from the extension's origin. For example:
