



Abraham Lincoln

Abraham Lincoln (ⁱ/ˈeɪbrəhæm ˈlɪnkən/; ní a bí ní Ọjọ kejilá, Oṣù èrèlẹ̀, Ọdún 1809, ó sì kú ní Ọjọ karundínlógún, Oṣù igbe, Ọdún 1865. Ó jẹ Ààrẹ kerindínlógún Orílẹ̀-èdè Amẹ́ríkà, tó sẹ̀jọba láti Oṣù Èrẹ̀nà Ọdún 1861 títí di Oṣù Kẹ́rín Ọdún 1865 tí wón sì paá sí orí ipò.

Lincoln jẹ olórí orílẹ̀-èdè nígbà Ogun Abẹ́lẹ̀ ní ilẹ̀ Amẹ́ríkà — Ogun tó dá lóri itàjèsílẹ̀ ẹrú, ọfin àti ìjìyàn ọ̀sẹ̀lú.^{[1][2]} Nígbà ogun nàà, ó dá ịṣọkan orílẹ̀-èdè dúró, ó sì fi ọ̀pin sí ọ̀wò ẹrú síṣe, ó fún ìjọba ní agbára, ó sì sí ojú-ọ̀nà sí ìlọ́síwájú orílẹ̀-èdè.

Ní ogun jìjà yìí ó dá ịṣọkan sí, ó fi ọ̀pin sí ọ̀wò ẹrú síṣe, fún ìjọba lágbára, ó sì jẹ kí ìlọ́síwájí bá okòwò ìlú. Ni àsìkò ogun yìí náàni Lincoln pàdànu ọmọ rẹ̀ ọkùnrin, ti ịṣẹ̀lẹ̀ yìí si jẹ ohun ibànujẹ fún un. Àmọ̀ síbèsíbẹ̀, kò kó ìrẹ̀wẹ̀sì ọkàn baa.

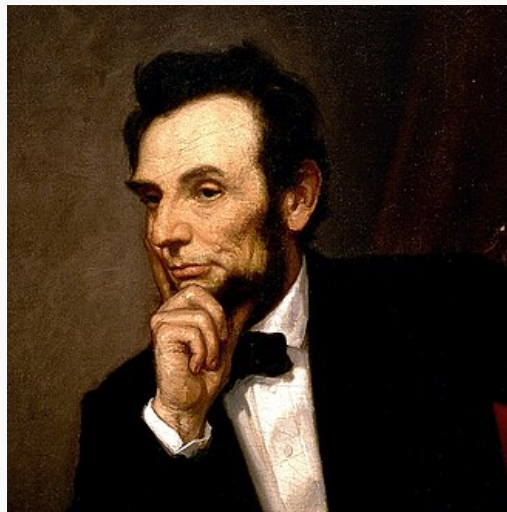

Ó kọ ara rẹ̀ ní ìwé, ó di agbejọ̀rò ní Illinois, Olórí Egbé Ọ̀sẹ̀lú Whig àti egbé ilẹ̀ ìgbìmọ̀ aṣòfin ti Illinois ní ibi tí ó ti lo ọdún méjìlálá. Wón yàn án sí ilẹ̀ ìgbìmọ̀ aṣòfin ti United States ní Ọdún 1846, Lincoln mú ìlọ́síwájú ba okòwò látàrí ilẹ̀-ìfowópamọ̀, owó orí ịṣòwò lókèèrè àti ọkọ ojú irin.
